Animarts - £10,000

Towards the core costs of creating a national training programme for arts animateurs.

Towards the salary over three years of an Assistant Education Officer for the Fitzwilliam Museum Courtyard Development which will provide a dedicated education space and new galleries.

Rethinking Crime & Punishment

Catholic Agency for Social Concern - £85,000

Towards the cost over two years of a criminal justice worker to raise awareness of restorative justice across the Christian denominations.

Children's Rights Alliance for England - £25,000

Towards the cost of an accessible compilation report on the treatment and care of young offenders in England.

Henley Management College - £51,100

Towards the cost of research into how the reputation of alternatives to prison can be improved with sentencers and the broader public.

Justice - £122,000

Towards the costs of a major inquiry into what scope there is for restorative justice to play a greater role in the criminal justice system.

Magistrates' Association - £25,000

Towards the costs of developing the 'Community Penalties Project' aimed at increasing knowledge of, and confidence in, community penalties such as probation and community service.

Payback - £19,975

Towards the costs of evaluating the campaign to reduce the use of prison for non-violent offenders and to create an evaluation toolkit for other criminal justice campaigners.
